For any parents' wishing to discuss their child's report, there will be an opportunity to do on Wednesday 5th July. See separate letter in report envelope for details on how to book an appointment.


TRANSITION MORNING - Friday 30th June

Therefore, we may decide not to send a pupil in for First Aid if there is no visible sign of injury and the 'accident' was very minor e.g. ran into another child and banged the muscly part of their arm. Staff will monitor the injury however, to ensure that there is no further discomfort.

SOCIAL NETWORKING BEHAVIOUR OUT OF SCHOOL

Orchard will always strive to maintain an excellent reputation for pupil behaviour both in school and also out of school hours. This includes 'online' issues which may arise.

As a school, we will investigate any incidents of misbehaviour or anti-social behaviour that we are made aware of and this is important to ensure any behaviour issues do not spread into the school day.

Recently, we have had to deal with several issues involving inappropriate WhatsApp messages.

It should be noted that dealing with issues involving social network sites takes up a huge amount of time by school staff, and notably, the school only has a limited level of jurisdiction for out-of-school behaviour.

In such circumstances, we would work alongside parents/carers to ensure they play the lead role in resolving such behaviour. However, we also reserve the right to involve other agencies to support our stance on out-of-school behaviour issues (for example, the police; Social Care/Early Help).

We would certainly be in immediate contact with such agencies if any aspect of safeguarding for the child/ren was being compromised by their out-of-school or online behaviour.

It is important for parents/carers to note that the school will always assist with out-of-school behaviour issues but cannot be held responsible or accountable for them.

GOVERNORS

We have a very strong board of Governors who, as volunteers, have worked hard this year to ensure that the school remains efficient and effective. My thanks to them for their support, input and ideas.

WATER BOTTLES

Please could all pupils bring a water bottle into school during these warmer weeks to reduce the need for beakers. Can you please ensure it has your child's name on. Thank you.

SUN AWARENESS

With the weather becoming warmer, it is advisable that children bring a hat/cap to wear outside.

On hot days, could you also please ensure that sunscreen is applied before your child comes to school. Sunscreen can also be brought into school for selfapplication. Please note that staff are unable to help children with this.

Please ensure all clothing is named so that the Lost Property basket doesn't get too full!

LOST PROPERTY

We have a mountain of clothing and other items without names in Lost Property and would therefore urge parents/carers to come into school to look through the basket. Children seem to struggle to recognise or retrieve their own items despite them being circulated at the end of break or lunchtimes!
