We are very much looking forward to the term ahead and to all the exciting activities we have planned.

Literacy: This half term we will be covering a range of genres including dairy writing and newspaper articles in the first half term and then a persuasive brochure in the second half term. Handwriting and writing stamina are still a key focus this term – it would be great if children could practise their handwriting at home too!

Numeracy: We will be completing our length and perimeter unit of learning. We will also be learning to tell the time accurately, investigating properties of shape, statistics, time, recapping fractions and money.
