





### History Key Vocabulary

<b>Past</b>	Something that has already happened.
<b>Era</b>	A long period of time
<b>Mesozoic era</b>	The time when dinosaurs lived
<b>Triassic</b>	The first dinosaur period
<b>Jurassic</b>	The middle dinosaur period
<b>Cretaceous</b>	The last dinosaur period
<b>Prehistoric</b>	Before people wrote things down
<b>Palaeontologist</b>	A scientist who studies fossils
<b>Mary Anning</b>	A famous fossil hunter
<b>Artefact</b>	An object from the past
<b>Dinosaur</b>	A reptile that live millions of years ago



Mary Anning was an English fossil collector, dealer, and palaeontologist. She became known internationally for her discoveries in Jurassic marine fossil beds in the cliffs along the English Channel at Lyme Regis in the county of Dorset, Southwest England.

<b>Ocean</b>	A huge area of salty water. Earth has 5 in total.
<b>Country</b>	A place with it own land and people
<b>United Kingdom</b>	A country made up of England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland.
<b>Capital city</b>	The most important city in a country
<b>Pangea</b>	A supercontinent millions of years ago
<b>Human features</b>	Made by humans (roads, buildings)
<b>Physical features</b>	Made naturally (rivers, forests)

<b>Living</b>	Something that is alive and grows
<b>Dead</b>	Something that was once alive
<b>Features</b>	Part of an animal or plant
<b>Omnivore</b>	Something that eats meat and plants
<b>Carnivore</b>	Something that only eats meat
<b>Herbivore</b>	Something that eats only plants
<b>Predator</b>	An animal that hunts other animals
<b>Prey</b>	An animal that is hunted by other animals
<b>Habitat</b>	The place where an animal or plant lives
<b>Skeleton</b>	The bones inside an animal
<b>Fossil</b>	The hard remains or imprint of something that lived long ago
<b>Extinct</b>	No longer alive anywhere in the world
