Pupils in LKS2 and UKS2 to mix at lunchtimes	We have allocated sections of the school grounds for each phase for several reasons:  a) To reduce collisions between our largest Y6 children and our youngest Y3 pupils especially - we used to have some awful accidents caused by bumps and trips between pupils  b) To enable our Sports Ambassadors to set up and lead specific activities for LKS2 children in a designated 'large' playground space  c) To enable several games of football to take place on the field between specific classes or pupil groups without fear of other children being hit by the ball d) To assist MDS in monitoring behaviour and pupil safety – it has been very noticeable that low level behavioural issues decreased considerably at lunchtime by keeping children in their phases.
