Reminders ...

How you can help

- Reading Reading is so important. Sadly, nationally, the number of primary aged pupils who do not complete any reading at home is increasing. At Orchard, we would like to redress the balance. We are having a massive push on reading this year to develop a love of books and 'reading for pleasure', especially in Key Stage 1. It would be great if children could be heard read at home at least 4 times a week, if not every day! Helping your child to use their phonics to decode words, to sound words out and to blend in order to build up their 'reading power' really is the most important thing you can do to help at home. We would ask that school books taken home come back each day as children will read in school too. Due to the nature of our decodable books, it may well be that the same book comes home to be read on several occasions this is to build up fluency. However, if there are any issues with the book selected, please feel free to contact us. Please use the Reading Record to note pages read etc. Once a week the Class Teacher or Teaching Assistant will then check diaries and respond to any comments that you may have written.
- Spellings Year 2 pupils are expected to practise their spellings in preparation for a weekly spelling test which takes place on a Friday. The spelling words will be a mixture of tricky and high frequency words and will definitely challenge your child at times. Please speak to us if you require advice on spelling tips and activities.

Homework Menu - For each Learning Adventure, children will receive a creative
 homework menu. They are free to choose whichever tasks they like. We ask that
 all pupils attempt at least 5 tasks. We are keen to stress that homework should
 only take up a small proportion of the evening/weekend. Pupils are allowed the
 whole half-term for completion of the tasks before bringing their homework book
 back into school in the last week. We are happy to extend homework deadlines
 where appropriate. However, we would kindly request your support in ensuring
 that your child's homework is completed to a high standard - all homework should
 be written in pencil, with care being taken over presentation and handwriting.

■ **PE Lessons** - PE will take place on a Monday and Friday. Please ensure that children are sent into school in their PE uniform on these days.

Labelling Property - Please ensure that uniform, water bottles, book bags, etc. are named – a name written in marker pen is fine.

Classroom News ...

Welcome to Class 2. The teaching team this year is Mrs Parker on a Monday, Tuesday and a Wednesday and Mrs Chapman on a Thursday and Friday, who will be supported by Mrs Jackson. We are all very much looking forward to working with your child.

All pupils have returned to school with an excellent attitude towards their learning and have impressed us with their enthusiasm, good manners and excitement about our first learning adventure.

Behaviour - Our school definition of respect is: 'having due regard for someone's feelings, wishes or rights'. As a class, we have reminded ourselves of the 'Respect Rule'. Respect for yourself. Respect for others. Respect for property. Respect for learning. Positive behaviour is praised and rewarded with Dojo points/House points, certificates and stickers.

Class Dojo - We will be using Class Dojo to share important school updates, post photos of classroom activities, and to respond to messages sent by parents, so don't forget to log in. Please remember to send any urgent messages such as last-minute changes of picking up to the office as these messages might not be seen or responded to in time. Staff will endeavour to respond to messages within a 48-hour working day window.

Communication - School Information will normally be sent to you via e-mail; flyers or letters. Often, letters with slips to return may go home via the book bag however, so please do check bags regularly.

Character Values - We always pump up our Character values big time in the Autumn Term, especially in relation to the following:

- Enthusiasm: Ready and keen to learn, and to contribute and enjoy.
- Concentration: The act of focusing your attention. The art of not being distracted.
- Curiosity: A strong desire to know something. Asking questions to learn more.
- Self-Control: Restraining yourself from doing something that may not be appropriate at the time. Involves self-control.
- Co-operation & Teamwork: The ability to work together.
- Kindness: Being generous, thoughtful, and friendly.
- Resilience: The ability to recover from difficulties.
- Listening: Listening politely and respecting other people's ideas.

We are very much looking forward to the term ahead and to all the exciting activities we have planned.

Literacy: As part of their green fingers learning, the children will firstly be writing their own
 instructions to make a fruit salad. We will then be writing our own stories using the papaya
 that spoke as our model text. After half term we will be, writing a character and setting
 description using Traction man as a model text.

Numeracy:

In Year 1, we will be starting with Number and Place Value up to 10. In Year 2, we will be starting with Number and Place Value up to 100. This provides the children with a basic knowledge which can be then transferred into other areas of learning. Lots of recapping will be done during this time extending the numbers that we use to ensure that all children are confident and familiar with numbers. We will then spend a few weeks focussing on addition and subtraction, using a range of methods to answer each question. Later in the term, Year 1 we will be looking at 2D and 3D shapes. In Year 2, we will be looking at money. We will continue to develop our problem-solving skills through focussing on talking about the different approaches we can use to solve problems.

■ Science: Pupils will be learning about plants: how the grow, what plants we have in school
■ and we will be looking at the structure of plants and trees. We will look at how we get food
■ and the food chain of some animals. We will then explore seasonal change and how that
■ affects the food we get. After half term, we will begin to look at the basic human body parts
■ and what a human needs to survive.

Learning Adventure (History, Geography, Music, Art, DT): Our Learning Adventure this half
 term is 'Green fingers.' We will be looking at where in the world is hot and comparing that to
 the UK. We will also think about how this can affect food produce. In DT we will be making our own fruit salad focusing on cutting and chopping skills. In art, we will be looking at
 Archimboldo and making our very own fruit and veg faces. After half term, we will be
 focusing on history in our Super Hero Me, where we will be exploring real life heroes like
 Florence Nightingale, Mary Seacole, Emily Davison and Rosa Parks. In DT, we will be making
 flying superhero scenes using sliders and in art we will be looking at Pop art using Roy
 Lichtenstein. Over the Autumn term in music, we are looking at orchestral instruments and introducing the children to pitch and tempo.

Computing: Pupils will learn about how technology is used all around us. They will then explore digital painting after half term.

PSHE: Family and Relationships & Health and Wellbeing.

■ RE: Autumn A - What does it mean to belong to a faith community?■ Autumn B - What makes some places sacred to believers?

■ PE: Stability & Locomotor skills (walking, marching, running, jumping, crawling,■ hopping, climbing, galloping, sliding, skipping and leaping).
