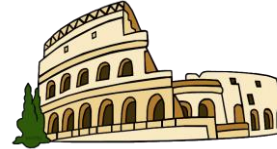


Numeracy

- Choose a times table and write it out using Roman Numerals
- Make up some Roman calculations using $VII + C =$
 $XX - V =$ Roman Numerals.
- Create 10 maths word problems for Roman children. Make sure you use Roman numerals in your calculations. You must also provide an answer sheet which shows your workings out. Remember to make them challenging.

Out and About!

- Visit a museum that gives you some information about the Romans. Write down 6 things you learnt!
- Look at holiday brochures and online to find out about modern day Rome as a tourist destination. Which tourist attractions would you visit? What is the weather like? Where else would you go in Italy?



Literacy

- Make a word search of places, names and words connected with The Romans.
- Learn at least 5 facts about a Gladiator. Make a fact file about what their life was like.
- Create an information page about what would make a good Roman soldier. Don't forget to use pictures to support your writing.
- Write an adventure story set in Roman Britain. Remember you will have to think of a dilemma and how it will be solved.

Working with Others

- The Roman's wore togas. With a friend or family member, see if you can work out how to make a toga. (Take a photo of you wearing it!). Write step by step instructions to explain how to put the toga on and what equipment is needed.
- Create your own board game with a Roman theme. It could include countries of the Roman Empire, Roman towns in Britain or famous Roman buildings. It could use cards, counters, a spinner or dice with Roman numerals. Play it with your family.

Expressive Arts

- Research, design and make your own Roman helmet or shield.
- Write a rap to remember facts about the Romans.
- Make your own Roman mosaic using cut paper, pasta shapes, seeds etc. Keep the design simple.
- Write the lyrics for a marching song that the Romans could sing while they march in training.
- Research and draw a Roman soldier. Label their uniform, equipment and weapons.

- Make up a Powerpoint quiz with facts about The Romans. Make sure you also have the answers!
- Make a model of something linked to The Romans. Bring it in for the display table or send a picture/video.
- Design a Roman Villa. Don't forget to label which materials you are going to use to make the house!

- Make some Roman Honey Cakes or any other Roman food. Write the recipe/take a photo/bring the food into school.
- The Romans introduced new foods into Britain. Find out which foods were introduced by the Romans that are still enjoyed today.
- Roman soldiers needed to be fit and tough to be effective warriors. Find out how Roman soldiers trained and kept fit and healthy.

- Write a list of 10 questions you would like to ask a Roman soldier who has come to Britain.
